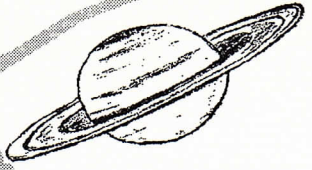
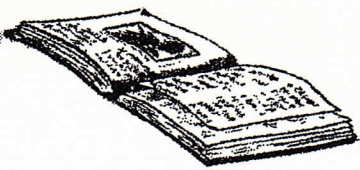

Also memorize what these symbols tell you to do:

▣ --- down bow

V --- up bow

*p* --- piano: play softly

*f* --- forte: play loudly

⋮ || --- repeat: play it again

// --- cut: stop your bow, watch the director

⤿ --- fermata: hold the note, watch the director
